

Research on "hunting poetry" used to declare the nonexistence of such courtly pleasure during the Mamluk period and research on "nature poetry" mainly focused on flowers, garden and spring up to around 1100.

This conference will explore the topic of hunting and nature more broadly in Arabic literature from 1100-1800 in many diverse literary fields, poetry and prose, in order to explore some of those treasures that have been ignored far too long. Next to different kinds of hunting we will observe the Nile flood, a supernova, several earthquakes, a fruit contest, and nature in religious contexts as well as how nature is transformed into abstract concepts.
