

English Department Info Sheet for Incomings (Non-Partner)

Incoming Students that study English at their home university but come from universities/faculties the English Department does not have an agreement with are very welcome to join courses at the English Department that meet their level of study. However, the following steps will have to be taken before starting their studies at the English Department.

Incoming students are required to take the C-Test at the Language Centre (Sprachenzentrum) prior to their advisory meeting at the English Department. There is a demo version of the test online:

A **minimum score of 70 points in the C-Test is required** to be eligible for courses at the English Department. After having taken the C-Test, students should make an appointment with the ERASMUS coordinator at the English Department, to present their result and acquire a place in suitable courses (exchanges.ed@uni-muenster.de). Please note that if the English Department offers courses especially tailored for incoming students, those are mandatory to take first. Further, our course system is an open one. Each term, courses on every level in the fields Literary and Cultural Studies, Linguistics and Didactics are being offered. The course titles and themes will change each term, however. If the course overview for your study period in Münster is not online yet at the time you need to make your Learning Agreement, we will do our best to make sure that you will get courses that form an equivalent in field, topic and level once you take up your studies with us.

Erasmus students usually acquire 5 ECTS credits per course at the English Department. Grades are usually acquired through term papers, essays or written or oral exams. If you need a grade for a course at the English Department, please make sure to discuss the conditions for acquiring a grade in a class with your coordinator and the respective teachers **at the beginning of your stay**.

With a result of less than 70 points, students can apply for English courses at the Language Centre that are especially tailored to the different result groups (e.g. 40-69 points):
