Invitation

We would like to invite you to take part in the 23rd Freudenstadt Symposium on Regionalism. In the year marking the 150th anniversary of organised social democracy in Germany and a bit more than a year before the Scottish Referendum for Independence, and against the backdrop of the on-going Euro crisis, we'll meet again at this year's Freudenstadt discussing regional perspectives on debt, policy options and changing identities in Europe. Integration or Disintegration – are countries and regions moving further together or move apart?:

- Consequences of the Euro crisis: The banking and the debt crises have thrown the European currency, stability and solidarity into turmoil. Austerity versus growth? More Europe versus less Europe? Core versus periphery? Will the Euro survive? The role of France, Germany and the UK How do the citizens and regions respond?
- Europe and Sustainability: technology, policy and innovation: Boosting sustainable development energy conservation & renewable energy ('Energiewende'), infrastructure & mobility, and a reduction of the costs of living; laying the foundations through training & education, languages & culture, citizens' participation & regional cooperation.
- Beyond the Referendum: constitutional futures in context: Recent and current constitutional developments in Scotland, Wales, England and Ireland: 'The State of the Union', including build-up to the Scottish Independence Referendum of September 2014 and beyond.

We are expecting speakers and participants - politicians, diplomats, academics & students, writers & journalists, businessmen, activists and individuals - from across Europe for a weekend of presentations, informal discussions, good food, and walks in the Black Forest – hallmarks of Freudenstadt for the past twenty years. And we can also celebrate the famous Stadtfest on Germany's largest town square...
