The **Cluster of Excellence “Religion and Politics”** has been investigating since 2007 the complex relationship between religion and politics across eras and cultures. The 140 researchers from 20 disciplines in the humanities and social sciences will focus in the new funding phase (2019 to 2025) on the “dynamics of tradition and innovation”. Epoch-spanning studies will analyze the factors that make religion the motor of political and social change. Particular attention will be paid to the paradox that religions often develop their innovative potential by drawing on their traditions.

The Cluster of Excellence is the largest of its kind in Germany and the only one in the country that deals with the issue of religion. The Cluster will be funded to the amount of 31 million euros from 2019 to 2025.

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The 400th anniversary of the Spanish Jesuit Jerónimo de Ezpeleta y Goñi (1549-1617) marked the beginnings of a new research initiative at the Institute of Missiology and the Study of Theologies Beyond Europe at the University of Muenster, on his legacy of cross-cultural and interreligious engagement with Mughal India and (posthum) with Safavid Persia through his *Āyena-ye haqq-namā* (*The Truth-revealing Mirror*; 1607). This conference not only commemorates some of Jerome's major contributions by presenting these recent achievements in Jerome Xavier scholarship, but also seeks to gather the expertise to help orient the new project and create an international postdoc research group for it at the University of Muenster.
